Annual General Meeting

The Roseville Golf Club Annual Meeting was held on Monday 27 April via Zoom. 56 members registered to watch. Rod Kitchen and Oliver Raggett spoke at the meeting. Key items covered included approval of the following - minutes of 2019 AGM, the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ending 31 December 2019 and the provision of expenditure and benefits to certain members.

Details of the new Vice-Captain and composition of the committees were to be agreed at the first Board meeting and were communicated later to the members. Rod reminded attendees that the achievements during 2019 and plans for 2020 had been relayed at length in the "Members Information update" video in February and the club's response to the Covid-19 crisis since that time had also been well and frequently communicated to members by Oliver Raggett, Paul Carey and himself so he had nothing further to add. However, Rod took the opportunity to note the considerable stress and change the crisis had imposed on everyone at RGC and he expressed his thanks to all involved – the GM and his staff, to Members and to the Board.

We farewelled Ian Irwin, Judi Leahy and Liz Galbraith and thanked them for their time served on the board and their dedication to the running of Roseville Golf Club. Graham Cole, Susannah Fortin, Pat McVean and Ruth Timbrell were welcomed on to the Board.

Mary's House Day – 26 June 2020!

As you know, we are unable to invite golfing friends from other clubs to our charity events. However, with restrictions easing, we have decided to run our Mary's House Day in-house on Friday 26 June. Mary's House colours are pale Blue – feel free to wear blue on the day. This event will be a 4BBB team event off the 1st and 10th tee and will include the 9 hole afternoon players – it is NOT a shot-gun start. We will charge \$35 to play on the day which will include a Devonshire tea stop as you pass the 9th or 18th tees and a donation to Mary's House. There will be a Golden Ticket (previously raffle) sold on the day and Min has offered his services to hit your ball over the dam for \$5. As we are in a cashless environment at Roseville, these monies will be debited from your House card – the \$35 will be debited on Wednesday 24 June. Please make sure you have topped up your House card. Bookings for this event will open on Thursday 11 June at 4.30pm. Get your team together!

Captain's Comments

At last we seem to be getting back to somewhat normal golf! As you know, we are starting the Tuesday draw from next week. The 9 hole comp will return to being played from the 10th tee after the morning 18 hole comp. Stroke rounds and Golf NSW Medal will recommence in July, so 7 July will be our 3rd Round of the GNSW and Club Medals (as we were able to play February and March), as well as the first round of the Alice Lang Salver.

There has been some confusion as to why some players are playing off the red tees (and hitting across the dam on the 12th) with a daily handicap of 26, while others are playing off the purple tees with the same handicap or even a handicap of 25.

Here is a very simplified explanation:

Your GA handicap determines your division at Roseville Golf Club as follows:

Division 1: 0 - 22.3 (red tees and hitting over the dam on the 12th)

Division 2: 22.4 - 30.2 (purple tees)

Division 3: 30.3 - 54 (purple tees and maximum playing handicap of 45)

Your daily playing handicap depends on a number of factors including your GA handicap and very simply put, the difficulty of the course you are playing. It is assumed you need more strokes on a more difficult course (red vs purple) so this means, for example, that a player with a GA of 22.3 plays from the red tees with a higher daily handicap than a player with a GA of 22.4 who plays from the purple tees. Result of Survey

Apologies for this being towards the end of this newsletter but we have only just had the result of the survey being:

- Return to 4 ball
- Continuation of the Tuesday draw
- 2 tee start

Moving forwards, the following changes will be taking place:

- Tuesday and Friday competitions will be a 4 ball off both tees.
- The Tuesday draw will recommence from 9 June.
- Booking sheets will open 8 days in advance at 4.30pm for the foreseeable future.
- The 9 hole comp will start on the 10th tee after the 18 hole morning competition has passed through.
- To accommodate the large number of people wanting to play in competitions, the 18 hole competition will continue from the 1st tee after the last of the earlier group has passed through.
- The 9 hole bookings will be open at 4.30pm 8 days in advance.

Women's Foursomes

This is a 36 hole stroke event (team of two play alternate shots) played over 2 days – 23rd and 30th June. The sign-in sheet will open this week and conditions of play will be posted downstairs on the noticeboard and on the website.

House Members



Auto Scorecards

Please take extra care when completing your scorecard to be left in the box outside the Pro Shop. The dot is to be placed in the Stroke column for your total SHOTS not your Stableford score. You put your Stableford score in the Results column. You must keep your playing partners score so you can double-check your results at the end of the game.

Here are a few tips on how to mark your scorecard:

Another REMINDER – count the dots on the card. There should be 18. It is easy to forget the last hole you played. Also, do a last minute check to ensure that all the dots are in the correct column.
