Friday Fun Day

Thankfully, with the easing of restrictions, we are able to hold our very popular Friday Fun Day on Friday 26 March. We will reschedule the theme that was set for March 2020, being "Once upon a time in Roseville". So dust off those absurd costumes you had ready 12 months ago. For those new to the day, nothing is too outlandish. The theme is open to interpretation.

Bookings will open on Thursday 11 March at 4.45pm.

It is a shotgun start so you can choose your tee (should you be using a cart, please consider the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 14th and 17th). Golf and Lunch (no golf only) will cost \$55 per person and we also offer **Lunch Only** to non-golfers for \$45. This will be deducted from your Housecard on Tuesday 23 March, so please make sure you have enough credit on your card. Please advise the office if you have any dietary requirements.

Captain's Comments

A reminder that the course will be closed on Tuesday 23 March for its bi-annual renovation. We will offer a 4BBB Ambrose event on Wednesday 24 March if you feel you are in need of an alternative game. Timesheets are now open. Unfortunately we cannot offer the traditional reciprocal tee times at Monash this year as they are in the same boat as us with very full timesheets.

As the greens will not be fully restored the week after coring, we will be holding our annual **3 Clubs and a Putter** Day on Tuesday 30 March. For those of you who have yet to experience this fun team day please put your names down. As the name suggests, you may only take 3 clubs and your putter to play the round. There is actually more to this than you may think. We play Roseville week in, week out, and we tend to play the same

club on the same hole every round. This forces us to try different shots with different clubs.

Further to my comments regarding the booking tee times, because of the large number of women wishing to book in at the same time, can you please make sure you "exit" that booking sheet ASAP in order for the remainder of the tee times to be available to the other members.

You may notice that the tee times off the 1st tee are 9 minutes apart (in order to alleviate a bank up on the 2nd hole, 4th hole). The 10th tee times are 8 minutes apart. Please keep to your tee time as indicated on your scorecard.

Another contentious issue – if you need to cancel your booking, please do so at your earliest convenience. We have a very large waitlist and is just a matter of courtesy to your fellow golfers. The cancellation of bookings is also a huge problem especially on Stroke / Medals Tuesdays. Because several members cancel, your name may be moved forward on the tee times. PLEASE CHECK your tee time the night before your competition and if at all possible, also on the morning of play.

For anyone who is a little worried about playing a stroke round, please remember there is a Drop Down Stableford available on any of our stroke days and the 9 hole competition is always Stableford on a stroke day.

Countbacks

For any newer members who are wondering what 'c/b' means when you see if after your name on the results page it stands for 'countback'. This occurs when, at the end of any competition, there are 2 or more players with the same score.

In Stableford or Par rounds, the method of a countback is as follows:

- 1. Total the (stableford) points of each player sharing the tie over the last 9 holes on the scorecard (10-18). The player with the best score wins.
- 2. If still tied, repeat the process on the last 6 holes only
- 3. If still tied, repeat the process on the last 3 holes
- 4. If still tied, the score on the 18th hole is used

Countback on a stroke round is a little more complicated:

- 1. Add up the scores for the last 9 holes and deduct half the player's handicap
- 2. If unresolved, add scores for the holes 13-18 and deduct one third handicap
- 3. If still unresolved, add the scores for the last 3 holes and deduct one sixth handicap
- 4. If still unresolved take score on the 18thh hole and deduct one eighth handicap

Luckily for us, this is all done by the computer, but I think it's safe to say it's a good idea to play well on the back 9!
